

assignment formatting

The majority of assignments will be submitted digitally through Google Classroom and other apps. All typed assignments must be in 12 PT FONT, double-spaced, and have 1" margins with your name, class period, and date in the top left corner with a centered title. Be sure to title your document file as well.

homework

Most work will be able to be completed in class if students use their time wisely. The exception to this would be typed essays. Some work may need to be done outside of classes to finish writing and/or typing final paper. Projects will likely require time outside of class to complete to the quality expected.

missing work

A missing work log will be completed each time you do not turn in an assignment. It will cost you 25% on the assignment – NO EXCUSES. You will be required to attend MONDAY LUNCH DETENTION each week until all missing work is made up. Failure to attend will increase your penalty to 50%.



policy for absences & grades

Much of the course will be a discussion and reaction format. It is imperative that you come to class prepared to make contributions. We will work both independently as well as in groups, and the contributions of each and every students are valued. Therefore, make it a priority to be in class.

If you are absent, you are responsible for completing your make-up work (one day for make-up for each day absent).

Daily work will be posted on my website. You are also encouraged to communicate with a classmate to make up any assignments.

If you know you are going to be absent beforehand, you should ask me for your makeup work before the absence. This can be done in class or via e-mail.

Weekly and daily work will be updated weekly (bell ringers, participation, and quizzes). Please check grades regularly and feel free to ask me any questions that you might have about a particular grade.



electronic devices

Electronic devices (including earphones) should be kept in your backpack. Devices should not be out during class, unless otherwise instructed by the teacher or with permission. Likewise, it is not acceptable to be on websites or apps unrelated to the learning during class time.
